Last Day for Refunds

First Summer Session (Term 202340): Last Day for Refunds- May 19
 Eleven-Week Summer Session (Term 202350): Last Day for Refunds- June 12
 Second Summer Session (Term 202360): Last Day for Refunds- June 28

REFUND POLICY: It is to the financial advantage of all students withdrawing, or dropping, classes to do so as early in the semester as possible. Refunds for **tuition and required fees*** will be made as follows for students who withdraw or drop to a lower amount of credit hours:

There will be no refunds available on special course fees including but not limited to private music fees, remedial math, or nursing fees after the first five (5) class days starting with the first official day of classes for each Summer Session.
